## HELP US CROSS THE FINISH LINE!

**W**ith construction now well underway after a successful groundbreaking in September, the Campaign

Steering Committee is pleased to report that we have raised approximately \$2.2 million in gifts, grants, and pledges. "Thanks to our generous donors, we are very close to reaching our goal and having the Library emerge from this modernization with an incredible facility and no debt whatsoever," said campaign co-chair Marian Sole. The Steering Committee is seeking to reach its \$2.3 million goal by the end of the year.

Since the beginning of 2017, nearly 100 new individual, business, and foundation commitments have been made ranging in size from \$10 to \$150,000. Our fabulous Friends of the Library made wonderful waves with their \$10,000 gift to the Campaign in honor of National Friends of Libraries Week! We are also fortunate to have received two major grant recommendations – a \$200,000 SAM Grant, with the assistance of State Senator Marchione, and a \$97,394 Public Library Construction Grant through the Mid-Hudson Library System written by Library Director AnnaLee

Giraldo. "With the end of the year upon us, it is a terrific time to give thanks and also to consider a tax-deductible charitable gift to the Library," said Board President Gary Spielmann. "There are still a few naming opportunities available, and we encourage everyone to think about buying a paver and giving that as a holiday gift to a friend or family member." If you would like to discuss a gift (all are tax deductible to the fullest extent allowed by law), please contact the Campaign Office at (518) 758-6192.

According to Campaign Assistant Max Valle, approximately 45 pavers have been claimed by generous donors to date. Available in two sizes, the pavers will be etched with donors' names and will be installed in the outdoor plaza area outside the large community meeting room and Children's Library. ### Consider Contributing Directly To KML from Your IRA

If you are 70 ½ or older, qualified charitable contributions (QCDs), allow taxpayers to make charitable contributions from their IRAs directly to KML and to exclude that amount from income. Not everyone qualifies, though. It only applies to IRAs, and only for owners or beneficiaries who are 70 ½ years old or older. The QCD is excluded from income and can satisfy the annual required minimum distribution (RMD) from the IRA. Please note that no charitable deduction is permitted for this contribution; otherwise that would double the benefit. Please consult your financial advisor to determine if this option could work for you.

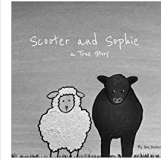

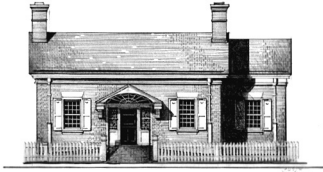

**T**he Friends' volunteer spirit is GROWING! Thanks to so many of you who helped to make our September book sale such a success. Over 50 people helped out, sorting and carrying books, baking for our café, setting up and breaking down our displays, and so much more. Countless others donated books, purchased them, and contributed generously at our café, resulting in the most profitable September sale in years!

Our CLYNK project is GROWING! Since we began this recycling effort in April as a Hannaford Community Cash partner, we have earned over \$800. **H**aving a library card means you can have 24-hour access, 7 days a week to the collections of 66 libraries in the Mid-Hudson Library System. Just fill out this form and bring to the library with some form of identification and proof of local residency such as:

- A driver's license or photo ID
- An envelope or postcard recently mailed to your street address
- A utility bill that lists your street address

The minute you have your card in hand you have access to nearly 2.5 million items that you can request online. You also get HomeACCESS which links you to current magazine, newspaper and journal articles from your home, school, or office. HomeACCESS includes the New York State Online Virtual Electronic Library (NOVEL) databases. To use HomeACCESS, visit the library's website ([kinderhooklibrary.org](http://kinderhooklibrary.org)), click on Online Research, enter the 14-digit barcode from your library card—and you're in!
