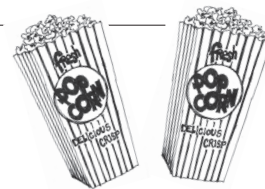

While the plans and ideas are exciting, no progress comes without growing pains. In the coming months, we ask for your patience and

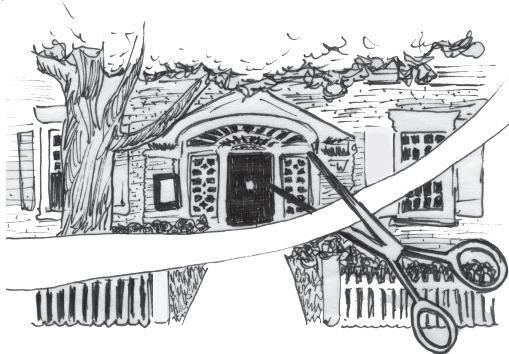

Stay tuned for changes, and for details on our grand opening celebration planned for Friday, December 14. Join us as we unveil the new space and open our biggest gift ever for our own community! During the

2018 may be coming to an end, but your Library is beginning a whole new chapter! What to Expect

September 1-23: Our Library operations will continue as normal during this period.

September 24-27: The Library will close for a few days as we move operations from our historic building into the new space to allow for renovations to the existing building.

September 28-December 2: Our Library operations will resume, but occur only in the new building, with all patrons entering through the new Sylvester Street entrance.

December 3-6: The Library will close for a few days as we move operations to their final places in the completed building.

December 7-13: We will hold a soft opening of the newly completed space, with patrons entering through the Hudson Street entrance. Some services may be limited as we work out the final kinks.

December 14: The Library will hold our Grand Opening Celebration & Candlelight Night!

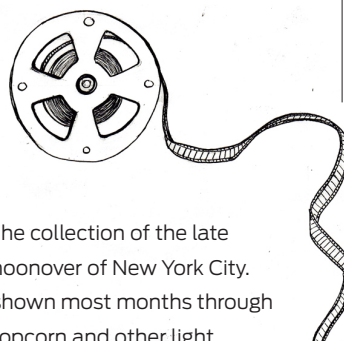
Candlelight Night at the Library: Nat Phipps Trio
